






Calibrachoa Notes

- Common name: million bells or calis
- Habit: Mounded trailing. Typically covers the bottom of the basket.
- Self cleaning no deadheading (except doubles).

Petunias













Petunia Notes

- Probably most common and best known annual
- Habit: Varies depending on variety. These varieties range from trailing to mounded-trailing.
- Incredibly resilient, heat tolerant, benefits from deadheading.

Petchoa





Petchoa Notes

- Cross between PET-unia and calibra-CHOA
- Habit: Mounded trailing.
- Flowers larger than calis, but smaller than petunias.
- Not as sticky as petunias.

Geraniums








Geranium Notes

- Among the most heat tolerant annuals, blooms continually all summer
- Habit: Varies depending on variety. Calliope and Marcada are mounded/trailing.
 Rocky Mountain and Presto are upright/mounded.
- Deadheading is easy and doesn't have to be done very often.

Lobelia

Lobelia Notes

- One of the only true blues
- Airy texture adds dimension
- Spreading habit doesn't trail too much.
- Modern varieties have been bred to take full sun / heat, but may still struggle with our lack of humidity.



Nemesia






Nemesia Notes

- Incredibly showy, most varieties very fragrant. Habit: Varies depending on variet: Nesia are upright/mounded. Sunsatia are spreading/trailing. Don't always hold up well to the heat and wind.


Verbena




Verbena Notes

- Very heat tolerant.
 Spreading habit they root in along their stems.
 Tend to spread their color well amid the other flowers, poking out here and there.
 Butterfly and hummingbird attractant.
 Some people itch after touching them.

Bacopa






Bacopa Notes

- Delicate, bridal looking
- flowers. Drops blossoms if it gets dry even once.

Osteospermum





- Daisy form flower blooms best in cooler temps (spring and fall), but can slow down or stop blooming in the hottest part of the summer.
 Daisy Falls is supposed to be more heat tolerant.
- Works great with more heat tolerant plants to take over during the summer.

Sanvitalia



Sanvitalia Notes

- "Creeping zinnia"
- Does best during the hottest part of the summer.

Scaevola



Scaevola Notes

- "Fan flower"
- Exceptionally heat tolerant looks great in high summer.

Mecardonia



Mecardonia Notes

- Groundcover plant that slowly spreads throughout the pot.
- No deadheading.
- Prefers consistent moisture, but is relatively drought tolerant.

Euphorbia



Euphorbia Notes

- Exceptionally heat tolerant looks great in high summer.
- Requires little water and no deadheading.

Phlox



Phlox Notes

- Mounded, compact habit only 8 to 12 inches tall.
- Doesn't trail truly mounding.
- Deadheading is easy (take off the whole flower cluster) and doesn't have to be done very often.


Salvia

- Exceptionally heat tolerant.
- Most are upright, Hummingbird Falls is trailing.
- Pollinator attractant.

Thunbergia Notes

- "Black-eyed Susie vine"
- Climbs up and trails down
- Vigorous (almost aggressive) grower.




